## Mountaineer Quickies

- ▶ WVU is 51-13 over its last 64 games; 27-8 in the BIG EAST in that span.
- ▶ WVU has won 62 of its last 78 regular-season games/WVU has won 66 of 84 overall games.
- ▶ WVU has the 11th-best record in college football in the last four years.
- ▶ WVU has the eighth-best record in college football in the last five years.
- ▶ WVU has the ninth-best record in college football in the last six years.
- ▶ WVU is 83-47-1 all-time in BIG EAST play/43-12 since 2002/10-4 under Bill Stewart.
- ▶ WVU has not finished lower than second place in the BIG EAST since 2002.
- ▶ WVU has had at least a 5-2 record every year in the BIG EAST since 2002.
- ▶ Dating back to 2005, WVU has 163 rushing touchdowns in its last 58 games (2.8 per game).
- ▶ WVU has outrushed its opponents in 52-of-58 games; WVU's record is 46-12 during that span.
- ▶ Since 2001, WVU has forced 261 turnovers, ranking No. 4 nationally.
- ▶ WVU is 54-4 since 2002 when winning the turnover battle.
- ▶ WVU is 12-3 when Noel Devine rushes for at least 100 yards in a game.
- ▶ Noel Devine has 3,381 rushing yards in his career, ranking No. 5 on WVU's career rushing chart.
- ▶ Noel Devine is first nationally among active players in rush yards, third in yards per carry & fourth in all-purpose yards.
- ▶ Jock Sanders has finished with at least one reception in 28-straight games, third in WVU history and 11th in BIG EAST.
- ▶ WVU is 15-2 in games played on turf under Stewart.
- ▶ WVU is 94-29-4 in season openers, including 92-18-6 in home openers.
- ▶ Since 2000, WVU is 10-0 against NCAA FBS opponents, including 2-0 under Stewart.
- ▶ Since 2000, WVU is 58-1 when scoring 30 or more points in a contest.
- ▶ WVU has made eight-straight bowl appearances, winning four of them.
- ▶ The 2010 senior class has a career record of 29-10.

## About Coach Stewart

► With a father-like personality held by few and a work ethic held by even fewer, New Martinsville, W.Va., native Bill Stewart enters his third full season as West Virginia University's head football coach.

Stewart hasn't looked back since hitting the ground running when he was named interim head coach three weeks prior to the 2008 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, preparing and rallying a team, a coaching staff, a school and a state.

After guiding the Mountaineers to a remarkable 48-28 victory against Oklahoma, and arguably the most memorable bowl win in school history, especially under the circumstances, Stewart was named West Virginia University's 32nd head football coach on January 3, 2008, one day after the impressive victory.

Since then, Stewart has produced consecutive 9-4 seasons, a victory over North Carolina in the Meineke Car Care Bowl in 2008, a berth in the 2010 Konica Minolta Gator Bowl and consecutive Top 25 finishes. Stewart's nine victories in 2008 marked the most by a first-year Mountaineer coach in school history.

Stewart has coached 20 players to all-BIG EAST accolades in his two seasons and watched quarterback Pat White become the NCAA's all-time leading rushing quarterback and the first in college football history to win four-straight bowl games as a starting quarterback in 2008.

Stewart is no stranger to Morgantown, the state of West Virginia or to the college football world as his coaching experiences have been vast and varied.

Prior to being named head coach, he spent eight years on the West Virginia staff under WVU coaches Don Nehlen and Rich Rodriguez, working with the Mountaineer tight ends and serving as associate head coach in 2007 after spending the prior seven seasons coaching the quarterbacks. He also had the role of special teams coordinator under Rodriguez.

His lengthy coaching resume began at Fairmont State, where he was a student assistant coach for a season, before becoming an assistant coach at Sistersville (W.Va.) High School in 1975. In 1977, he moved to Salem College, where he was assistant football and head track coach for two seasons. In 1979, he moved to the University of North Carolina (1980); he was later an assistant at Marshall (1980), William & Mary (1981-83), Navy (1984), North Carolina (1985-87), Arizona State (1988-89) and Air Force (1990-93).

Stewart came to WVU in January 2000, from the Canadian Football League, where he served as offensive coordinator of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers in 1999, tutoring two all-conference receivers and a 1,000-yard rusher. As offensive line coach for the CFL's Montreal Alouettes in 1998, Stewart's line blocked for Mike Pringle, the first 2,000-yard rusher in CFL history.

A 1975 education graduate from Fairmont State, where he was a three-year letterman and team captain for the WVIAC champions in 1974, Stewart earned his master's degree in health and physical education from WVU in 1977.

Highly regarded as one of the "good guys" in the profession, Stewart has had several personal and professional life influences starting with his mother, father and older brother.

Stewart and his wife, Karen, also a native of New Martinsville, have one son, Blaine.

**Series Record Against Coastal Carolina**

► The matchup with Coastal Carolina marks the first meeting between the two schools, the two coaches and the 13th time the Mountaineers have faced a team from the Big South Conference. WVU leads its series with VMI, 11-0, and defeated Liberty in last year's season opener, 35-21. This marks the Chantideers' third FBS opponent, as they lost at Penn State in 1998, 66-10, and 18-0 at Kent State last year.

**Non-Conference Play**

► West Virginia finished the regular season with a 4-1 record in non-conference games in 2009, having defeated Liberty, East Carolina, Colorado and Marshall at home, while losing on the road at Auburn. With the postseason loss in the Gator Bowl to Florida State, West Virginia is 9-4 all-time under Bill Stewart in non-conference games and 7-0 under Stewart in non-conference home games. Currently, West Virginia is riding a 13-game non-conference home winning streak. Counting the Gator Bowl, West Virginia was 4-2 in non-conference games in 2009.

West Virginia's last non-conference loss at home was a 34-17 defeat to Virginia Tech back on Oct 1, 2005. On their way to the 13-game non-conference home winning streak, the Mountaineers have defeated Marshall, Eastern Washington and Maryland in 2006, Western Michigan, East Carolina and Mississippi State in 2007, Villanova, Marshall and Auburn in 2008 and Liberty, East Carolina, Colorado and Marshall in 2009.

**BIG EAST Bests**

► The Mountaineers posted another winning league record in 2009 with a 5-2 mark. West Virginia's undefeated 7-0 BIG EAST record in 2005 matched the best league record by the Mountaineers since entering the conference in 1991. In 1993, West Virginia also posted a perfect 7-0 mark in BIG EAST play. Next in line is a 6-1 record in 2002 and 2003. The Mountaineers have been crowned league champions in four of the last seven years and finished in second-place in 2006, 2008 and 2009.

West Virginia's third-best league record is a 5-2 mark, posted in 2009, 2008, 2007, 2006 and also in 1998. WVU has now posted 14 winning conference seasons in 19 years of BIG EAST action starting in 1993 (7-0), 1994 (4-3), 1995 (4-3), 1996 (4-3), 1997 (4-3), 1998 (5-2), 2002 (6-1), 2003 (6-1), 2004 (4-2), 2005 (7-0), 2006 (5-2), 2007 (5-2), 2008 (5-2) and 2009 (5-2).

West Virginia is 83-47-1 in all-time BIG EAST play and is 44-20-1 in BIG EAST home games followed by a 39-27 mark in conference road games. Coach Bill Stewart is 10-4 overall in BIG EAST play with a 6-1 home record and a 4-3 road record in the conference. The Mountaineers are 43-12 in BIG EAST games since the start of the 2002 season, and 26-9 in their last 35 conference games. WVU has won league championships in 1993, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007 and finished in second place in 2006, 2008 and 2009.

**Against The BIG EAST**

► WVU is 127-103-7 all-time against current members of the BIG EAST Conference. WVU is 27-30 against Syracuse; 31-4-2 against Rutgers; 9-2 versus Louisville; 14-3-1 versus Cincinnati; 6-0 against Connecticut; 38-61-3 against Pitt; and 2-3 against USF. Since the league started in 1991, WVU is 83-46-1 in all-time BIG EAST play and 44-20-1 in league home games, while 39-26 in league road games.

**National Polls**

► The Mountaineers enter the 2010 season ranked No. 25 in the Associated Press Poll and tied with Utah for No. 24 in the USA Today Coaches Poll. WVU finished the 2009 season ranked No. 22 in the USA Today Coaches' Poll and No. 25 in the Associated Press Poll. That marked the fifth-straight year that WVU has been ranked in the final AP Poll and four of the last five years in the USA Today Coaches' Poll.

In 2009, WVU received a national ranking in the nation's Top 25 for six weeks, entering the polls at No. 22 on Oct. 18 in both the AP and the USA Today Coaches' Polls and moved up to No. 20 the week of Oct. 25. The Mountaineers dropped out in the Nov. 1 polls, and were receiving votes.

WVU re-entered the USA Today Coaches' Poll on Nov. 8 at No. 23 and received votes in the AP Poll. WVU dropped out of the USA Today Coaches' Poll on Nov. 15. The Mountaineers made a re-appearance in the Nov. 29 polls at No. 23 in the USA Today Coaches' Poll and No. 24 in the AP and moved to No. 17 in the USA Today Coaches' Poll and No. 18 in the AP Poll after the Rutgers win.

West Virginia spent 46 consecutive weeks in the national polls from Oct. 9, 2005 - Sept. 28, 2008. The Mountaineers were ranked in the Top 10 for 31 out of the 38 weeks. Since 2002, West Virginia has been ranked in the Top 25 for 64 weeks, including 33 weeks in the Top 10.

In the Nov. 25, 2007 poll, the No. 1 ranking in the USA Today Coaches Poll marked the first time in the school's history that the Mountaineers had received a No. 1 ranking. The highest ranking before that was No. 2 in the 1993 season.

**For Starters**

► Entering the 2010 season, the Mountaineers have a total of 25 players with at least one game of starting experience.

Tops on that list are senior defensive linemen Scooter Berry (28) and Chris Neild (27) and senior linebacker J.T. Thomas with 26 consecutive starts.

Senior receiver Jock Sanders has 25 starts to his credit, senior cornerback Brandon Hogan 24 and senior running back Noel Devine has started 23 games.

**At Home**

► The 2010 season marks the 31st season of competition for West Virginia at Mountaineer Field at Milan Puskar Stadium. WVU holds a 136-49-4 (.730) all-time record at the facility, which opened in 1980.

A 2009 season-opening crowd of 57,950 was in attendance for the Liberty game, 59,216 were in attendance for week two against East Carolina, a sell-out crowd of 60,055 was at the Colorado game, 54,432 for the Marshall game, 58,106 for the UConn game, 55,334 for the Louisville game and 56,123 for the home finale against Pitt. The Mountaineers averaged 57,317 per home game; a total of 10,168,483 fans have watched a game at Mountaineer Field.

**Rolling After Bowling**

► In the 27 seasons after going to a bowl, the Mountaineers have compiled a 204-114-5 record. WVU has earned back-to-back bowl berths 15 times, including eight straight, currently a school record.

**The 2010 Mountaineer Roster**

► The 2010 roster consists of 101 players from 17 different states and two foreign countries. Leading the way is the Mountain State, represented by 23 players, Florida (18), Pennsylvania and Ohio (13), Maryland (10), Virginia (9), Alabama, New York and New Jersey (2) and one from Arizona, California, Georgia, Kentucky, Michigan, South Carolina, Tennessee and Texas. Defensive lineman Curtis Feigt hails from Berlin, Germany, and Soraya Aisien-Ogbebor is from Lagos, Nigeria.

**McMichael Rejoins Mountaineers**

► David McMichael joined the Mountaineer staff for his second coaching tenure at West Virginia and will oversee the tight ends and offensive special teams.

McMichael has directly coached 11 NFL signees and has had seven players who were drafted by NFL teams, including first-round selections Brian Jozwiak (Kansas City -- 1986) and Anthony Becht (New York Jets -- 2000). He has recruited a total of 14 eventual NFL players, including 11 draftees. He has also worked with five All-Americans and coached in 15 bowl games.

McMichael returns to WVU after serving as an assistant coach at Connecticut for the past nine years. McMichael spent 18 years at West Virginia as an assistant coach under Don Nehlen, coaching the offensive tackles and tight ends. Prior to that, he had stints at Southern Illinois (1980-82) as the defensive line coach and three years (1977-79) as the offensive line coach at Muskingum College in New Concord, Ohio. While at Southern Illinois, McMichael helped lead the Salukis to a 10-1 record and the 1983 Division I-AA Championship.

**Nine x Seven**

► West Virginia posted nine wins in 2009 for the fifth year in a row, marking one of seven schools to accomplish that feat. The Mountaineers posted nine wins for the past two years and 11 wins in each of the three seasons before that.

**Eight x 11**

► West Virginia posted a 9-3 record in 2009, marking the eighth-straight year that the Mountaineers have won at least eight games in a season. Ten other schools have accomplished this feat: Boise State, Boston College, Georgia, LSU, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Texas, Texas Tech, USC and Virginia Tech.

**Perfect at Home**

► The Mountaineers tallied a 7-0 home slate for the 2009 season. That marked the first undefeated home record since the 1993 season and the 11th time overall when WVU had at least five home contests. West Virginia posted perfect slates in 1988, 1983, 1969, 1962, 1948, 1925, 1924, 1922, 1919 and 1905. The Mountaineers had undefeated home records but had ties in 1985 and 1957.

**Against Ranked Teams**

► Beginning with a 27-0 loss to Fordham on Oct. 18, 1941, West Virginia has played 130 games against nationally ranked teams. Of those, 37 have been Mountaineer victories. Since 2001, WVU has posted 13 victories over ranked teams.

**On Network Television**

► The CBS telecast of the WVU-Florida State game on Jan. 1 marked the 159th network television game for West Virginia. All-time, WVU is 79-79-1 in nationally televised games.

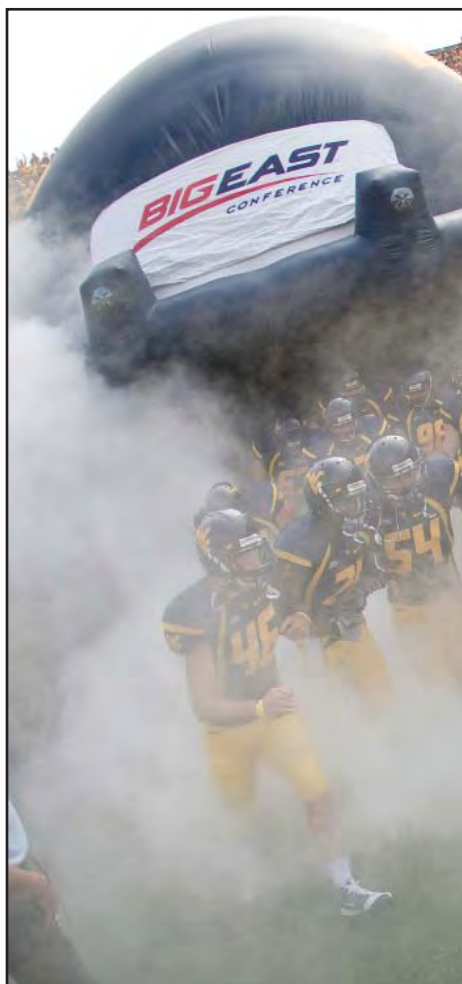
**WVU vs. 2010 Slate**

### 30 Is Enough

► Dating back to 1980, the Mountaineers hold a 144-8-1 record when scoring 30 or more points in a game. During the 1990s, the Mountaineers were 42-4 when scoring 30 or more points in a contest and were 40-2-1 in the '80s when reaching that mark.

WVU is 62-2 since 2000 when scoring 30 points or more in a contest.

### Double-Digit Wins

► In WVU's nine victories in 2009, five came by a double-digit margin. In its nine wins, WVU held a 10.5 point margin of victory, and outscored its opponents by an average of 26.6 to 20.8.

### Scoring in the Classroom

► The Mountaineers have had equal success on the field and in the classroom in recent years, as 41-of-43 student-athletes, including a perfect 23-of-23 in 2009-10, have graduated from WVU under coach Bill Stewart.

**The Numbers From Two, Three, Four, Five, Six, Seven**

▶ The West Virginia Mountaineers have been one of the best teams in college football in the last seven years.

West Virginia's two-year record (2008-09) of 18-8 is tied for 21st-best in college football.

West Virginia's three-year record (2007-09) of 29-10 is 15th-best in college football.

West Virginia's four-year record of 40-12 is 11th-best in college football behind only Boise State (49-4), Florida (48-7), Texas (45-8), Ohio State (44-8), BYU (43-9), USC (43-9), TCU (42-10), Oklahoma (42-13), Cincinnati (41-12) and Virginia Tech (41-13).

West Virginia's five-year record of 51-13 is the eighth-best in college football behind only Texas (58-8), Boise State (58-8), Florida (57-10), USC (55-10), Ohio State (54-10), TCU (53-11) and Virginia Tech (52-15)

West Virginia's six-year record of 59-17 is ninth-best in college football behind Texas (69-9), Boise State (69-9), USC (68-10), Florida (64-15), Ohio State 62-14), Oklahoma (62-18), Virginia Tech (62-18) and LSU (60-18).

And finally, West Virginia has 66 wins over the last seven years, which is good enough for 12th-place in college football.

**Luck is with the Mountaineers**

▶ Former West Virginia University and NFL quarterback and Academic All-American Oliver Luck was named WVU's director of intercollegiate athletics on June 10.

The two-time Academic All-American is a member of the Academic All-American Hall of Fame and was a Rhodes Scholar finalist. He was also a National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete, graduating from WVU magna cum laude in 1982.

Luck played quarterback for the Mountaineers from 1978-81, setting school records for touchdown passes and completions, and leading the team to a Peach Bowl victory over Florida as a senior. He ended his career as a three-year starter with school records of 43 career touchdown passes and 466 completions out of 911 passing attempts. His 5,765 career passing yards ranks him fourth on the school's all-time passing list. He was inducted into the WVU Sports Hall of Fame in 1997.

**The Signal Caller**

▶ The 2010 season marks the second-straight year in which the Mountaineers will have to break in a new starting quarterback. Jarrett Brown had a successful senior season after taking the reins in 2009.

Sophomore Geno Smith has earned the starting position this season. Despite facing limitations in the spring because of a broken bone in his left foot, he was able to throw during the non-contact drills and fully participated in fall camp.

The right-armed slinger saw action in five games last season, completing 32-of-49 passes for 309 yards and a touchdown. His top performance was in relief of Brown against Marshall when he threw for 147 yards on 15-of-21 passing and a touchdown in the 24-7 victory. He also was pushed into action against Florida State in the Minolta Gator Bowl and completed 8-of-15 passes for 92 yards.

True freshmen Barry Brunetti and Jeremy Johnson will add depth.

**One Last Push**

▶ After having an outstanding junior year, running back Noel Devine decided to return for his senior season instead of entering the NFL Draft. His outstanding speed and ability make him a candidate for the top award in the land, the Heisman Trophy.

Devine, a unanimous first team all-BIG EAST Conference selection, WVU's Co-Offensive MVP selected by the coaching staff and a semifinalist for the Maxwell Award, had one of the best seasons for a Mountaineer running back in school annals in 2009, rushing for a career-best 1,465 yards, the fourth best single-season performance in school history, on 241 carries, with 13 touchdowns, a 6.1 yards-per-carry average and 112.7 yards per game average.

His numbers ranked him second in the BIG EAST and No. 17 nationally. He posted seven 100-yard rushing efforts on the year and had seven rushes of 50 yards or more, four of which went for touchdowns.

He posted his career-high rushing performance last season against Colorado, when he ran for 220 yards on 22 carries and a touchdown. He also ran for 178 yards against Connecticut and 168 yards against Florida State in the Konica Minolta Gator Bowl.

Devine is currently No. 5 on West Virginia's career rushing chart, registering 3,381 yards, averaging 6.5 yards per rush and 23 touchdowns. He also ranks No. 10 on the BIG EAST's all-time rushing yardage list. He has rushed for 100 or more yards in 15 games in his career, tying for No. 10 in the BIG EAST career rankings.

**Short-Yard Solution**

► Fullback Ryan Clarke emerged in 2009 as a threat for the Mountaineers, complementing the elusive running of Noel Devine. The bruiser fixed West Virginia's short yardage problems from 2008 with several key short yardage conversions throughout the season, including a big fourth-down conversion on the game-winning drive against Pitt. While only toting the ball 60 times, he still managed eight touchdowns, which converted into a score every 7.5 carries.

Clarke, awarded the Danny Van Etten Rookie of the Year Award by the WVU coaching staff and selected to the all-BIG EAST freshman team by ESPN.com, is the second leading returning rusher from a year ago after finishing 2009 with 250 yards on the ground and a solid 4.2 yards per rush average.

**Two Scorers are Better Than One**

► Prolific players usually travel in pairs, and seniors Noel Devine and Jock Sanders are no different. A vital part of the Mountaineer offense, the duo combined for 18 of WVU's 43 touchdowns in 2009, with at least one of the two scoring in almost every game.

Through 38 games as teammates, WVU is 5-1 when both Devine and Sanders score a touchdown. The Mountaineers are 17-1 when just one produces points. WVU is 1-8 when neither Devine nor Sanders registers points.

Despite Devine's one-yard TD run in the 2010 Gator Bowl, the Mountaineers could not hold on for the win. The loss was the first for WVU when either Devine or Sanders records a score.

**Marked Men**

► Entering their final season with the Mountaineers, running back Noel Devine and slot receiver Jock Sanders are marked men off the field.

A frequent name on pundit's preseason Heisman Trophy watch lists, Devine was named second-team preseason All-American by *Lindy's Football Preview*, third team by *Athlon Sports* and fourth-team by *Phil Steele*. He was also tabbed "best instincts" in the BIG EAST by *Sporting News*, and selected All-BIG EAST preseason first team by *Athlon Sports*, *Phil Steele's*, *Sporting News* and *Yahoo! Sports*.

Additionally, Devine has been named a candidate for the Doak Walker Award and earned a spot on the Walter Camp Watch List.

A dual-threat option, Sanders was named all-BIG EAST preseason first team by *Phil Steele* and *Yahoo! Sports* and second team by *Athlon Sports* as a punt returner. He was also selected second team by *Athlon Sports* and *Phil Steele's* as a wide receiver. Additionally, Sanders was tabbed "Fastest Receiver" in the BIG EAST by *Sporting News*, and has been named to the Paul Hornung Award Watch List.

**Slashing, Streaking Sanders**

► As a junior, wide receiver Jock Sanders collected 72 receptions, the fourth-highest amount of catches by in a Mountaineer in a season. Along with Noel Devine, Sanders also decided to return for his senior season instead of leaving early for the NFL Draft.

Sanders led the WVU receiving corps with 72 catches, the second-best mark in the BIG EAST, for 688 yards, an average of 9.6 yards per catch and three touchdowns. He also was one of the team's punt returner, finishing with 17 returns for 146 yards, an average of 8.6 yards per return with a long of 35 yards.

Sitting No. 5 on WVU's all-time receptions chart with 137, Sanders is currently on a 28-game streak with at least one reception. That streak ranks No. 3 on WVU's reception streak list and No. 11 on the BIG EAST streak list.

His top performance last season was against Auburn when he collected 12 catches for 115 yards and a touchdown. He finished with eight or more catches in five games.

► With two catches in the Gator Bowl, Jock Sanders, WVU's Co-Offensive MVP named by the coaching staff, stands alone at No. 11 on the BIG EAST's all-time consecutive games with a reception list, having hauled in a pass in 28-consecutive contests.

Sanders' streak began with WVU's 2007 loss to Pitt. Rutgers' Brian Leonard has the all-time BIG EAST Conference record at 47 games.

David Saunders (1995-96, 1998) was the last Mountaineer to go at least 28-straight games with one catch, as he opened his streak in the 1995 loss at Maryland and ended with a loss against Missouri in the 1998 Insight.com Bowl.

### The Long Shot

► Brad Starks, an all-BIG EAST preseason third team by *Phil Steele's*, is WVU's second-leading returner at receiver in 2010, after finishing his sophomore campaign with 29 catches for 405 yards and two touchdowns. He averaged a team best 14.0 yards per catch last season, and 45.1 yards per game, which ranked him No. 15 and No. 16 in the BIG EAST in those categories.

Starks led the Mountaineer receivers in the Gator Bowl with three catches for 30 yards and will team with Jock Sanders in 2010 to give the Mountaineers one of the best dual receiving threats in the BIG EAST.

### Awesome Austin

► Wide receiver Tavon Austin emerged as another Mountaineer weapon in his 2009 rookie campaign. Back for his second season, Austin, an all-BIG EAST preseason third team honoree as a kickoff returner by *Phil Steele*, is not only expected to start at wide out, but should also use his outstanding speed and quickness at slot receiver, too.

A true dual-threat, Austin caught 15 passes for 151 yards, placing him sixth on the all-time freshman receiving list. He introduced himself to the Mountaineer faithful against ECU in his first-career start, blazing down the field, splitting three defenders, pulling down a 58-yard Jarrett Brown pass and streaking into the end zone for his first career touchdown.

He proved his versatility in his first season, not only scoring through receptions, but also on a kick return and on a run. Austin's last six points came via his feet, as he helped replace an injured Noel Devine in the second half of the Louisville win and steamrolled into the end zone from nine yards out. In total, he had six rush attempts for 47 yards on the season.

### The Insured Options

► Fully incorporated into the Mountaineer offensive scheme, tight ends Tyler Urban and Will Johnson are reliable options and dependable blockers for WVU.

Urban, a two-year starter, saw action on more than 440 plays in 2009, catching 10 passes for 117 yards and one touchdown. The 2008 Danny Van Etten Rookie of the Year honoree owns three career scores.

Johnson, a senior, is a quality blocker that can produce in a clutch. The owner of two career touchdowns, Johnson tallied a career-long 33-yard reception at Syracuse in 2009.

### Strong & Steady

► Four starters from last year's offensive line return this season. Those starters played the majority of the offensive snaps, giving them needed experience.

Out of a total of 855 offensive snaps, junior left tackle Josh Jenkins played 853 plays, senior center Eric Jobe on 852, junior left tackle Don Barclay on 839 and sophomore guard Joe Madsen on 840 plays. Senior tackle Matt Timmerman was used on 51 plays, redshirt freshman center and guard Jeff Braun saw action on 27 plays and redshirt freshman guard John Bassler and redshirt junior Chad Snodgrass were used on 13 plays.

Jenkins, Barclay and Madsen are set to resume their starting roles, while Braun and redshirt freshman Cole Bowers are slotted as the starters at right tackle and right guard, respectively.

Behind the blocking of the line, the Mountaineer offense had a 1,000-yard rusher for the 13th time in the last 14 seasons and the first 2,000-yard passer since 1998. WVU ran for 186.4 yards per game, passed for 191.1 yards per game, had 377.5 yards of total offense and scored 26.2 points per game.

The line helped the Mountaineer offense lead the BIG EAST in rushing yards and was No. 24 in the nation. WVU has led the BIG EAST in rushing yards in six of the last seven years.

Barclay led the offensive line with 64 knockdowns and 15 thunderbolt blocks, Jenkins had 46 knockdowns and 10 thunderbolt blocks, Madsen finished with 43 knockdowns and seven thunderbolt blocks and Jobe had 18 knockdowns and one thunderbolt block.

**Scoring 20 or more in a quarter**

► West Virginia's 21 points in the first quarter at Auburn marked the only time in 2009 that the Mountaineers posted 20 or more points in a quarter.

In 2008, WVU scored 20 or more points three times in a quarter. WVU has scored 20 or more points in a quarter 31 times since 2001 and done it in two quarters of a game six different times.

**The Middle Man**

► Redshirt senior Chris Neild will be counted on to be a defensive playmaker and defensive leader from the nose tackle position.

An All-American candidate, Neild has been named all-BIG EAST preseason first team by *Athlon Sports*, *Phil Steele*, *Sporting News* and *Yahoo! Sports*. Additionally, he is a candidate for the 2010 Lowes Senior CLASS Award.

Despite being double-teamed, the all-BIG EAST Conference second-team selection by the league coaches and ESPN.com, and a *Phil Steele* third-team honoree, finished his junior season with 35 tackles, including 13 solo, and two for loss.

He also had one pass deflection and had his first career interception. The interception came on the final drive against UConn in West Virginia's 28-24 victory. During that game, Neild also recorded two solo and three assisted tackles.

Neild was named the WVU Defensive Champion after his performances against Auburn, Colorado, Syracuse, Marshall, UConn and Rutgers.

**Seasoned Berry Back for One More**

► Fully recovered from offseason shoulder surgery, senior defensive lineman Scooter Berry, an all-BIG EAST preseason third team selection by *Phil Steele*, is back for one last stand with the Mountaineers.

Despite missing five games in 2009 and limited in others with injury, Berry finished the campaign with 15 tackles, including eight solo stops, one sack and two tackles for loss.

His best performance came in the national spotlight when West Virginia traveled to Cincinnati. Berry finished the game with one solo tackle and three assisted.

**Tackling Machine**

► Julian Miller burst onto the scene as a redshirt sophomore last season and made a name for himself, and he enters 2010 as one of the players to watch on the Mountaineer defense. The All-American candidate was named all-BIG EAST preseason second team by *Athlon Sports* and *Phil Steele*. He also was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award list.

Arguably WVU's biggest defensive success story in 2009, Miller finished with 53 tackles, including 30 solo stops, which was most among WVU defensive linemen and second most among defensive linemen in the BIG EAST.

Miller's totals also included nine sacks and 14 tackles for loss, a team high in both categories, and helped him earn third-team all-BIG EAST by *Phil Steele*. He enters 2010 with a streak of 18-straight games with at least one tackle, the fourth-longest streak on the team and best among WVU defensive linemen.

His sacks were the fourth-most in the BIG EAST and he tied for sixth in tackles for loss. His 14 tackles for loss tied for fifth on the WVU single-season tackle for loss list with Grant Wiley (2000, 2003), James Davis (2001) and David Upchurch (2001).

His top performance came against Louisville when he recorded six tackles, including five solo stops and three sacks. Two of his sacks came in the Cardinals' last drive of the game.

He was named the WVU Defensive Champion after his performances against Liberty, Marshall, Louisville and Rutgers. Miller also was named BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week against the Cardinals.

**Legacy Fulfilled**

► Redshirt senior weak-side linebacker J.T. Thomas is a defensive playmaker who will be counted on to be one of the defensive leaders this season.

A leader on and off the field, Thomas, an All-America candidate, was named all-BIG EAST preseason first team by *Athlon Sports*, *Phil Steele*, *Sporting News* and *Yahoo! Sports*. He also was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award list.

An all-BIG EAST Conference first-team selection by the league coaches, he finished second on the team in tackles (76), tied for second in tackles for loss (7), tied for third in interceptions (2) and had five pass breakups in 2009. Thomas finished with six or more tackles in eight games.

In the BIG EAST rankings, Thomas tied for No. 14 in passes defended and tied for 20th in total tackles. The weak-side linebacker was named co-defensive champion by the WVU coaching staff for the Liberty game after finishing with seven tackles, including four solo stops, assisting on a sack and having 2.5 tackles-for-loss.

At Auburn, Thomas had a season-high nine tackles, including five solo and a tackle for a loss.

He is a second generation linebacker as his father, J.T., Sr., played at WVU in 1994 and 1995 and was an all-BIG EAST selection as a senior.

**Lazear Levels Hits**

► The West Virginia defense returns its leading tackler from a year ago in senior linebacker Pat Lazear, an all-BIG EAST preseason second team selection by *Phil Steele*.

His team-high 78 tackles in 2009 ranked No. 17 in the BIG EAST, and earned him a second-team all-league selection by *Phil Steele*.

Lazear tied for fourth on the team in tackles for loss with six, and fourth in solo tackles with 34. In 2010, Lazear will be one of the leaders of the defensive unit that ranked fourth in rushing defense in the BIG EAST and 37th nationally last season.

The Mountaineer defense returns its top three tacklers from a year ago in Lazear, fellow linebacker J.T. Thomas and cornerback Brandon Hogan. All three should be big play performers in 2010.

**One Last Stand**

► Seven seniors return to lead the Mountaineer defense this season, making the unit one of the most experienced in the nation.

Scooter Berry and Chris Neild will anchor the line, while Anthony Leonard, J.T. Thomas and Pat Lazear will hold down the middle of WVU's vilified 3-3-5 stack. Brandon Hogan and Sidney Glover will provide experience and insurance in the backfield.

The Mountaineers ranked fourth in the BIG EAST in 2009 in total defense, allowing 336.5 yards per game. WVU only allowed 28 touchdowns last season, the second-lowest conference mark.

### Bitancurt's Golden Foot

► After a successful rookie campaign, kicker Tyler Bitancurt, an all-BIG EAST preseason first team selection by *Athlon Sports*, *Phil Steele*, *Sporting News* and *Yahoo! Sports*, returns for his second season as the Mountaineers' field goal kicker.

Bitancurt's inaugural season was a success, as he connected on 13 of 15 field goal attempts, 41 PATs, hit four field goals in a game twice and had the game-winning last second 43-yard field goal to defeat No. 8 Pitt. His year went so well, that he earned first-team all-BIG EAST honors from the league's coaches.

His 80 total points in 2009 rank third in all-time freshman scoring at WVU and rank No. 10 on the school's all-time single season kick scoring list. In the BIG EAST last year, Bitancurt ranked No. 5 in field goals made, No. 5 in kick scoring and No. 10 in overall league scoring.

### Quick Six

► Whether it be a punt or kick return, the Mountaineer return men all have one common goal - to score.

Slated to return punts for WVU this season are seniors Jock Sanders and Brandon Hogan. Sanders, named all-BIG EAST preseason first team by *Phil Steele* and *Yahoo! Sports* and second team by *Athlon Sports*, owns 195 career return yards, including a long of 35-yards attained in 2009. He ranked third in the BIG EAST in 2009, averaging 9.7 yards per return.

Arguably two of the fastest Mountaineers donning the Old Gold and Blue, senior Noel Devine and sophomore Tavon Austin will return kickoffs for WVU.

Austin, an all-BIG EAST preseason third team honoree by *Phil Steele*, was explosive as a returner throughout his rookie campaign, returning 17 kicks for 426 yards, and averaging 25.1 yards per return, the fourth-best BIG EAST mark. His most prolific return came at the onset of the UConn game, as he took the opening kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown. His single game kickoff return average against the Huskies (59.0) tied for the third-best mark in BIG EAST history.

Held to just seven returns over the last two seasons, Devine hopes to bookend his career with another stellar season as a kickoff returner. Devine opened his Mountaineer career tallying 511 yards on 22 returns for an average of 23.2 yards per return.

### Veteran Secondary

► The West Virginia defense's secondary unit will be one of the strongest on the field this season, and the corners, led by senior Brandon Hogan, junior Keith Tandy and redshirt freshman Brodrick Jenkins, are ready to shut down opponents' deep threats.

Hogan, an all-BIG EAST preseason first team selection by *Athlon Sports*, *Phil Steele*, *Sporting News* and *Yahoo! Sports*, and the left cornerback, was the team's third-leading tackler last season, finishing with 74 total stops, including a team-leading 46 solo tackles and two tackles for loss. The 2009 all-BIG EAST first team performer led the team in pass breakups with 11 and finished with one interception and recovered a fumble.

Hogan has been named to the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List.

Tandy, who returns as the starter at right cornerback and an all-BIG EAST preseason third team selection by *Phil Steele*, was the sixth-leading tackler on the squad last season with 61 total tackles, including 41 solo stops and four tackles for loss. He also had three interceptions, four pass breakups and a fumble recovery. Tandy finished in a tie for No. 14 in the BIG EAST in passes defended and tied for No. 10 in interceptions.

Jenkins, the beneficiary of a strong offseason, looks to make a splash alongside Hogan and Tandy this season.

### Defensive Shield

► Comprising one of the most secure positions within the Mountaineers' lethal defense, All-America candidates Robert Sands and Sidney Glover return to lead the WVU safeties.

Sands enters his third season in Morgantown surrounded by hype, as he has been named a preseason second-team All-American by *Phil Steele* and a first team all-BIG EAST selection by *Athlon Sports*, *Phil Steele*, *Sporting News* and *Yahoo! Sports*. Tabbed "Hardest Hitter" by *Sporting News*, Sands has been named to the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List.

A 2009 all-BIG EAST performer, Sands, the free safety, was the fifth-leading tackler on the team, collecting 65 total tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss. He led WVU in interceptions with five and was second in pass breakups with eight. He led the BIG EAST in interceptions and passes defended and tied for No. 28 in total tackles. Sands' top performance came against Florida State in the Konica Minolta Gator Bowl, when he registered a game-high 13 tackles, including a team-high two tackles for loss.

Glover, the spur safety and an all-BIG EAST preseason second team selection by *Athlon Sports* and fourth team honoree by *Phil Steele*, was the seventh-leading tackler last season, registering 60 total tackles, including 39 solo stops, 1.5 sacks and seven tackles for loss. He also finished with two interceptions, four pass breakups, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Glover was No. 17 in the BIG EAST in pass defended and tied for No. 28 in total tackles.

### Punting Options

► Redshirt senior Gregg Pugnetti and redshirt sophomore Corey Smith will split time punting this season in an effort to replace Scott Kozlowski.

Neither punter has seen action before in a Mountaineer uniform. Pugnetti has provided quality depth behind All-Americans Kozlowski and Pat McAfee, while Smith is a transfer from Alabama. Smith, named to the all-BIG EAST preseason fourth team by *Phil Steele*, is slated to handle the Mountaineer kick-off duties.

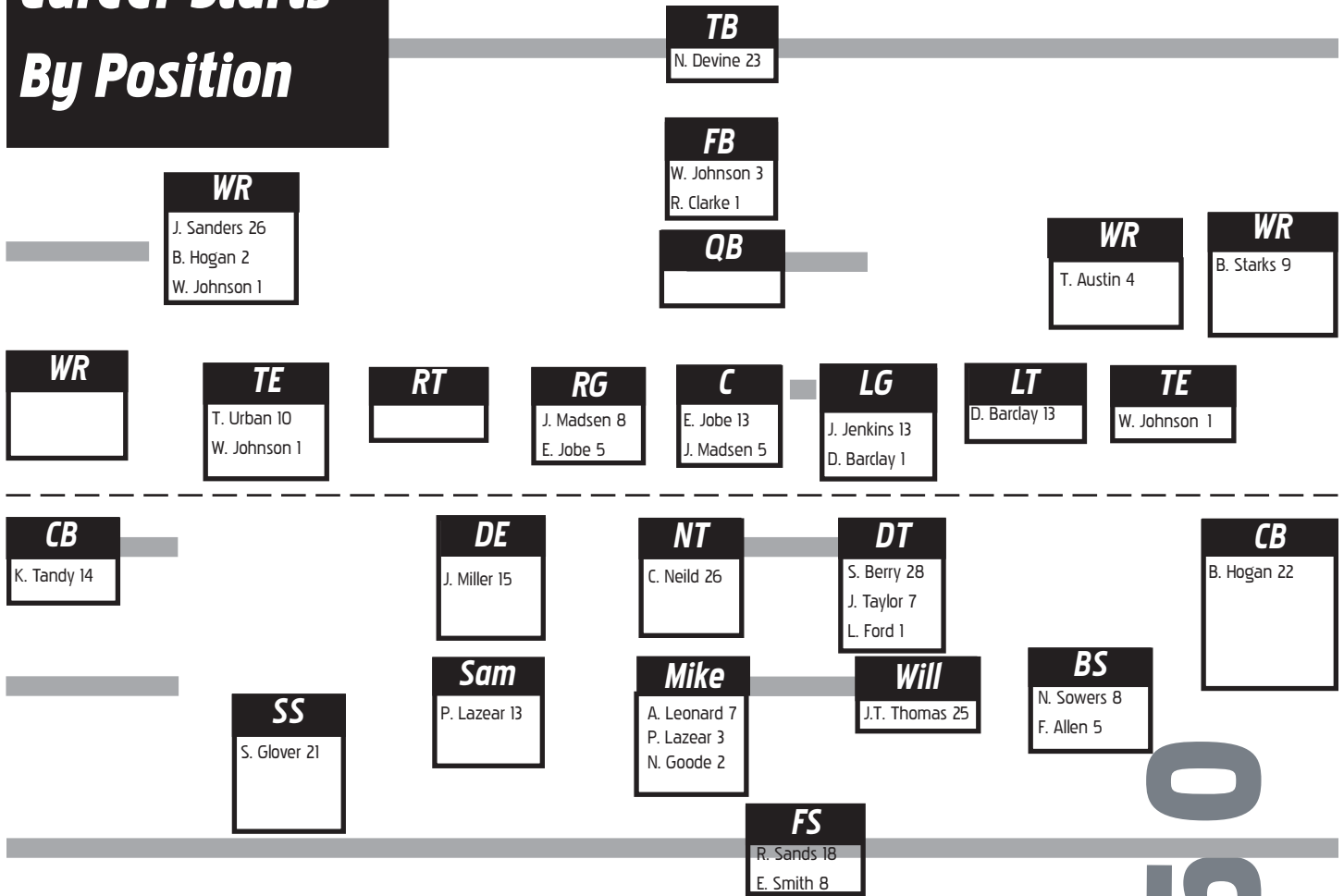
