Today's Game

- This afternoon's non-conference game between WVU and Miami University will be televised nationally by ESPNU.
- Veteran WVU athletic trainer Randy Meador is a 1984 graduate of Miami University. Meador grew up less than a mile from the Miami University campus in Oxford.
- The Mountaineers have played seven of their first 10 games away from the WVU Coliseum, the fewest home games of any team in the BIG EAST.
- The Mountaineers have won 28 of their last 30 games in the month of December.
- Alex Ruoff became West Virginia's 45th 1,000-point scorer against Cleveland State on Dec. 6.
- Da'Sean Butler needs 27 points to reach 1,000 points for his career.
- Joe Mazzulla and Alex Ruoff are listed as day-to-day with shoulder injuries. Jonnie West is sidelined indefinitely.
- Devin Ebanks was named BIG EAST Rookie of the Week on Dec. 15. He has grabbed 44 rebounds in the last three games and has posted three consecutive double-doubles.
- WVU has won 32 of its last 37 non-BIG EAST games and 37 of its last 43 non-league contests (includes postseason).
- West Virginia has posted a record of 106-44 (.710) since the start of the 2004-05 season.
- The Mountaineers have a 60-22 record since the start of the 2006 season.
- West Virginia is 41-2 at home against non-conference teams in the last seven years, including 23 wins in a row.
- Overall, West Virginia is 46-5 at the WVU Coliseum in the last four seasons.
- WVU was predicted ninth in the BIG EAST preseason poll. The Mountaineers have finished higher than their preseason prediction in each of the last six seasons. WVU reached the BIG EAST semifinals last year.
- Bob Huggins picked up his 600th career win against Canisius on Dec. 22, 2007. Only three active coaches have won more games (Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim and Jim Calhoun).
- Huggins is the 29th Division I coach to reach 600 career victories (minimum of 10 years coaching in Division I).
- Huggins needs two more wins to move past Norm Sloan for 28th place on the NCAA Division I all-time coaches list.
- Alex Ruoff is the only senior on the WVU roster this season. Eight of WVU's players are freshmen or sophomores.
- WVU is 425-122 (.776) all-time at the WVU Coliseum. WVU has won 85 percent of its home games in the last six years.
- West Virginia has won 25 games in a row at home in the month of December. WVU is 12-3 in games on Dec. 20.
- West Virginia has sold more than 7,000 season tickets, the most ever in school history.
- The Mountaineers are one of just five teams to reach the NCAA Sweet 16 in three of the last four seasons. The others are Villanova, Memphis, Texas and North Carolina.

Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 623 games in his 27 seasons as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks fourth in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks ninth in winning percentage (.735) among Division I head coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 23 of his 26 seasons, including 16 NCAA tournament appearances.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but four of his 26 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.7 victories a season.
- Huggins has made one NCAA Final Four and three NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year five times.
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings seven times.
- Huggins has coached nine All-Americans and 49 all-conference selections.
- Huggins has coached 15 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins ranks 29th among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.



Bob Huggins, a 1977 graduate of West Virginia who has won 623 games as a collegiate head coach, was introduced as West Virginia University's 21st men's basketball coach on Good Friday, April 6, 2007.

Huggins, 55, has compiled a 623-224 (.735) record in his 27 seasons as a head coach, which includes stints at Walsh College (1980-83), Akron (1984-1989), Cincinnati (1989-2005), Kansas State (2006-07) and West Virginia (2007-present). He ranks fourth in total victories

and ninth in winning percentage among active Division I head coaches.

Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 23 of his 26 seasons, including 16 NCAA tournament appearances. His squads have won 20 or more games in all but four of his 26 campaigns, including 30 or more twice, and he has averaged 23.7 victories a season.

In his first season at West Virginia, Huggins took the Mountaineers to the NCAA Sweet 16, becoming the first Mountaineer coach to take a team that far in NCAA tournament play in his first season. With 26 victories, he won more games in his first year than any other coach in WVU history. West Virginia tied the school record for BIG EAST victories with 11. After finishing the season with a No. 17 ranking, Huggins was named state coach of the year by the West Virginia State Sportswriters Association.

Following Huggins' first season at WVU, Director of Athletics Ed Pastlong announced that Huggins signed a 10-year contract extension that will keep the veteran coach at his alma mater until his 65th birthday.

Huggins also had his sixth first round NBA draft pick and fourth lottery pick when WVU's Joe Alexander was selected as the eighth pick by the Milwaukee Bucks. Alexander's first-round selection was WVU's highest NBA pick since Ron Williams was picked in the first round of the 1968 NBA Draft.

Huggins has coached 15 NBA draft selections as well as nine All-Americans. He has also guided 49 all-conference selections in Division I, with Alexander the most recent when he earned first team all-BIG EAST honors in 2008.

Alexander was just one of four Huggins' players to earn major awards in 2008. Alex Ruoff was named a third-team Academic All-American by *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA, one of just 15 players named nationally and the only student-athlete selected from a BIG EAST school. Ruoff also earned the BIG EAST Scholar-Athlete Sport Excellence Award. Darris Nichols earned the BIG EAST Sportsmanship Award, and Ted Talkington was named the BIG EAST Men's Basketball Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

On Dec. 22, 2007, Huggins became the 29th Division I coach (minimum 10 years coaching in Division I) to reach 600 victories when the Mountaineers won at Canisius.

In 2006-07, Huggins led Kansas State to 23 victories, the Wildcats' most wins in 19 years. Kansas State broke an eight-year postseason drought when Huggins led the Wildcats to the NIT second round. The Wildcats also collected 10 Big 12 wins for the first time since the league's inception in 1997. Huggins earned USBWA District VI coach of the year honors as well as Big 12 coach of the year by the *Kansas City Star*.

Huggins elevated the Bearcat program to among the nation's elite. He registered a 399-127 record (.759) during his tenure, making him the winningest coach in terms of victories and percentage in the school's rich basketball history. The Bearcats advanced to postseason play in each of his 16 seasons, reaching the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament three times and in 1992, appearing in the Final Four. Huggins directed Cincinnati to 10 conference regular season titles and eight league tournament titles.

A proven success as a program builder, recruiter and game strategist, Huggins directed the Bearcats to successive finishes in the Final Four and Elite Eight. Over the ensuing seasons, he developed young and inexperienced squads with as many as three freshmen starters into squads that captured two more league titles and made another pair of NCAA appearances. Huggins surprised the basketball world in 1998 by directing a team that had only one returning starter to a 27-6 record, conference regular season and tournament titles, a No. 2 seed in the NCAA tournament and a Top 10 finish in the polls. Huggins' 2002 team, unranked when the season began, posted a 31-4 record, setting a Cincinnati mark for victories.

Huggins has also directed star-studded teams, while developing the individual talents of players such as consensus All-Americans Danny Fortson, Kenyon Martin and Steve Logan, to a succession of conference championships and NCAA tournament runs.

Huggins has achieved similar success on the recruiting trails. He signed three No. 1-rated junior college players and five McDonald's All-Americans to Cincinnati, while six of his last nine recruiting classes

ranked among the nation's Top 10. His 2007 recruiting class at Kansas State was ranked No. 1 in the country by several outlets. *Rivals.com*, *Scout.com* and *Sports Illustrated*. Huggins' first West Virginia recruiting class has earned a Top 10 ranking by several scouting services.

Huggins earned the Ray Meyer Award as the Conference USA coach of the year a record three times (1998, 1999 and 2000), and was a unanimous choice as the Conference USA coach of the decade. He was selected as national coach of the year by ESPN.com in 2002. He was named co-national coach of the year by *The Sporting News* in 2005 and was *Basketball Times'* national coach of the year in 1998. He earned national coach of the year recognition from *Hoop Scoop* in 1992 and *Playboy* in 1993.

In 2002, Huggins suffered a major heart attack on the last Saturday of September but was present for the team's first practice two weeks later and coached the Bearcats with the same intensity that has become his trademark. The 2003-04 season was business as usual for Huggins, who piloted the Bearcats to Conference USA regular season and tournament titles and an NCAA tourney berth while amassing a 25-7 record.

Huggins earned his first head coaching assignment at Walsh College (now University), an NAIA school in North Canton, Ohio, in 1980 at the age of 27. A program with just two winning seasons in the previous 17 years, Huggins transformed the Cavalier program into one of the best in the NAIA ranks in just three short seasons. He compiled a 71-26 record (.732) from 1980 to 1983, twice guiding the team to the postseason, including their first-ever NAIA national tournament appearance.

After coaching the team to 14 victories in his first season, Huggins helped produce a 23-9 record in his sophomore campaign and an NAIA district playoff appearance in 1981-82, which include the school's first Mid-Ohio championship. His final team finished the regular season with a 30-0 record and a No. 2 national ranking before winning four more games to qualify for the program's first-ever NAIA national tournament. The Cavaliers lost in the national tournament to Salem College, 65-63, to end the nation's longest winning streak of 34. Huggins was twice named NAIA District 22 coach of the year following the 1982 and 1983 seasons.

After a one-year stint as an assistant coach at Central Florida in 1983-84, Huggins accepted his first Division I head coaching position at Akron in 1984. He quickly resurrected another program that had fallen on difficult times, as he guided the Zips to a 97-46 (.678) overall record and to postseason play in three of his five seasons. The program posted 20 or more wins in a season on four occasions.

After a 12-14 mark in his first season, Huggins led Akron to its first NCAA tournament appearance and conference title at the Division I level in 1986 with a 22-8 record. Winners of the Ohio Valley conference regular season and tournament championship, the 15th-seeded Zips lost in the first round of the NCAA tournament to fifth-seeded Michigan, 70-64. In guiding the team to its highest win total in 13 seasons, Huggins was named the Ohio Valley conference coach of the year. He continued his success with the first of three consecutive 21-win seasons in 1987 and an appearance in the first round of the NIT. Huggins capped his five-year tenure at Akron in 1989 by helping the Zips to their second trip to the NIT in 1989 with a 21-8 record.

While at Akron, Huggins coached Brian Roth, who earned All-America honors in 1985, while Eric McLaughlin earned Academic All-America honors in 1989. Three players earned first team all-conference honors during his tenure, including two-time selection and 1986 Ohio Valley conference player of the year Marcel Boyce. McLaughlin was also named tournament MVP during the Zips' run to the Ohio Valley tournament championship in 1986.

After his playing career at West Virginia, Huggins began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at WVU for his college coach, Joedy Gardner, in 1977. He moved to Ohio State the following season to assist head coach Eldon Miller. During his two-year stint from 1978-80, Huggins helped the Buckeyes to a 40-20 (.667) record and a pair of postseason appearances, including the second round of the 1980 NCAA tournament.

Huggins was a three-year all-Ohio selection and the 1972 Ohio player of the Year while playing for his father, Charles, at Indian Valley South High in Gnadenhuetten, Ohio. He first attended Ohio University but transferred to West Virginia after his freshman season.

Huggins was a three-year letterman for the Mountaineers under Gardner from 1975-77. As a senior and tri-captain, he helped the squad to an 18-11 overall record and a tie for the Eastern Collegiate Basketball League (ECBL) Western division title. In addition to helping the team earn their highest win total in nine seasons, he was named most valuable player after pacing the squad with 3.8 assists per game average.

A two-time Academic All-American, Huggins graduated from West Virginia magna cum laude in 1977 and received his master's in health administration from WVU in 1978.

Huggins was born in Morgantown on Sept. 21, 1953. He and his wife, June, have two daughters, Jenna Leigh (25) and Jacqueline (22).

Scouting Miami University

- Miami University is 6-3 on the season following a 62-50 win over Valparaiso last Saturday.
- The RedHawks have won four games in a row. Their last loss was a 60-53 defeat at Xavier on Nov. 29.
- The RedHawks have also dropped games at UCLA (64-59) and at Pitt (82-53).
- Charlie Coles, a 1965 graduate of Miami University, is 213-158 in 13 years at Miami and 305-242 overall (19 years).
- Coles has never faced West Virginia. Coles is 0-7 against Bob Huggins (all meetings while Huggins was at UC).

Series Record

- Today's game is just the second in school history between WVU and Miami University.
- The only other meeting was during the 1950-51 season with the Mountaineers winning in Morgantown, 94-59.
- West Virginia is 16-13 against current members of the Mid-American Conference: Akron (1-2), Bowling Green (3-0), Buffalo (1-1), Kent State (1-0), Miami University (1-0), Ohio (7-9), Toledo (1-1) and Western Michigan (1-0).
- Coach Bob Huggins has won seven meetings in a row with Miami University. Overall, Huggins is 7-2 against the RedHawks (all games were played while Huggins was Cincinnati).
- Huggins last faced Miami University on Dec. 27, 2004, with the Bearcats coming away with a 77-53 victory.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 100th season and 106th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- This season marks the 50th anniversary of the 1958-59 team that went 29-5 and fell to California, 71-70, in the NCAA championship game.
- The 1958-59 team will be honored during the WVU-Louisville game at the WVU Coliseum on March 7.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,534-932 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 24th among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 21 NCAA berths and 15 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 15 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past four years, the Mountaineers reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had eight first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Kevin Pittsnogle became WVU's first All-American in 34 years when he was named to the John Wooden All-America team in 2006.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, New Jersey Nets President Rod Thorn and Utah Jazz broadcaster "Hot Rod" Hundley.
- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15), The Ark (1916-27), Stansbury Hall (1928-69) and the WVU Coliseum (1970-present). When the WVU Coliseum was closed due to asbestos removal during the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

In The Rankings

- West Virginia received votes in five of the first six AP and ESPN/USA Today polls of the season.
- WVU cracked the AP rankings last season on Dec. 17 at No. 24, then moved to No. 23 on Dec. 24. WVU was ranked No. 23 on Dec. 24 in the ESPN/USA Today poll.
- The Mountaineers were ranked for two weeks last season and 22 weeks total since Jan. 3, 2005.
- Two years ago, the Mountaineers were ranked as high as 21 in the AP poll and 18 in the ESPN/USA Today poll.

Against Ranked Teams

- The Davidson game marked the 199th time in school history WVU played a team ranked in the AP Top 25.
- With wins over No. 10 Marquette, No. 15 UConn and No. 9 Duke a year ago, WVU now owns 59 wins over AP-ranked teams.
- Since WVU joined the BIG EAST in 1995, the Mountaineers have played 91 nationally-ranked teams. The school has played 199 total games against nationally-ranked competition. That means 45 percent of the games against the very best teams in the country have come during the last 13 seasons.

Winning Non-Conference Mark

- West Virginia has posted a winning non-conference record for 16 consecutive seasons.
- West Virginia is 49-10 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last five seasons.
- The last time WVU did not post a winning non-league record was 1990-91, when WVU went 4-4 outside of conference play. West Virginia went 11-2 in non-conference games last season.
- WVU has finished with one loss during non-conference play in five different seasons. They were: 1981-82 when West Virginia went 11-1 out of the Atlantic 10, 1957-58 when WVU lost only to Duke in going 11-1, 1996-97 when the Mountaineers were 7-1, losing the season opener at Minnesota, 2004-05 when WVU went 10-1 outside the BIG EAST and 2006-07 when the Mountaineers went 12-1 with their only loss to Arkansas.
- WVU has had one perfect non-conference regular season, 10-0 in 1997-98.

In Good Hands

- Senior Alex Ruoff became WVU's 45th 1,000-point scorer against Cleveland State on Dec. 6.
- Ruoff now shows 1,003 career points, ranking 43rd in school history.
- One of the best passers in the BIG EAST, Ruoff has dished out 314 career assists.
- Ruoff has made 193 3-point field goals during his Mountaineer career, ranking fourth all-time in school history.
- As a sophomore, he finished with 191 assists, the third most in a season in school history.
- He posted a career-high 28 points on 10-of-12 shooting (6-of-8 from 3-point range) against Auburn in 2007-08.
- Ruoff had seven 3-point field goals against Delaware State and finished with a game-high 25 points.
- Last year, Ruoff was named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll on Dec. 10, Dec. 24 and Jan. 7.
- Ruoff was second on the team in scoring in 2007-08, averaging 13.8 points per game.
- He had his first double-double of his career with 11 points and 11 rebounds against Marshall last season.
- Ruoff was second in the BIG EAST in 3-pointers and third in 3-point field goal percentage last season.
- He was named an *ESPN The Magazine* third team basketball Academic All-American by CoSIDA.
- Dating back to Johannes Herber, WVU has had an Academic All-American in four of the last five seasons.

The Butler Did It

- Junior Da'Sean Butler started all 37 games as a sophomore, averaging 12.9 points per game.
- Butler poured in 38 points to go with 11 rebounds in the exhibition win over Mountain State on Nov. 8.
- This year, he scored 22 points to go with 10 rebounds in the win at Ole Miss, then had a career-high 24 points and 14 rebounds against Davidson. He now has five double-doubles for his career.
- Butler has scored 973 points during this career. After his sophomore season, Butler tallied 841 points. Since freshmen became eligible to play, only two Mountaineers have scored more points after their freshmen and sophomore seasons: Warren Baker (857) and Drew Schifino (854).
- As a freshman, Butler earned all-BIG EAST rookie team honors.
- The Newark, N.J., native averaged 10.1 points per game, despite not starting one game as a freshman.
- Butler had his first career double-double with 15 points and 12 rebounds vs. USF. He added his second double-double of his career against DePaul with 14 points and a career-high 13 rebounds. Butler had his third double-double of his career at St. John's with 18 points and 10 rebounds. All of those came in his sophomore year (2007-08).
- He was named to the BIG EAST Weekly Honor Roll on Jan. 21, 2008, and Dec. 8, 2008.
- With 10 rebounds at Notre Dame, Butler became the first freshman in 13 years to record 10 or more rebounds in a game. Freshman Damian Owens pulled down 10 rebounds on Dec. 17, 1994, against Virginia Tech.

ESPN College GameDay Coming March 7

- ESPN's College Basketball GameDay will be making its first-ever appearance in Morgantown on March 7.
- WVU will face Louisville at 9 p.m., that day on ESPN in a game that marks the final BIG EAST regular season game of the year.
- The show is scheduled to broadcast live twice that day, both for one hour at 11 a.m. and then again at 9 p.m.

Newcomer Impact

- It hasn't taken long for Bob Huggins' nationally-ranked recruiting class to make an impact on this year's team.
- The class of Darryl "Truck" Bryant, Devin Ebanks, Kevin Jones and junior college transfer Dee Proby was ranked in the Top 10 by many scouting services.
- Bryant is averaging 10.8 points per game, while starting the last three games at point guard. He had a team-high 18 points in the win at Duquesne.
- Bryant has scored double figures in seven of WVU's first nine games.
- Ebanks has started every game and is averaging 8.1 points and 7.1 rebounds. He became the first freshman in 13 years to post a double-double when he had 10 points and 17 rebounds against Cleveland State.
- Ebanks followed the Cleveland State game up with 13 points and 17 rebounds against Davidson, becoming the first freshman in school history to grab 17 or more rebounds in back-to-back games.
- Ebanks became the first WVU player to grab 17 or more boards in back-to-back games since Maurice Robinson did so in 1977.
- In the next game, Ebanks recorded 15 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in the win at Duquesne. He became just the third freshman to record three straight double-double games, joining Warren Baker (1973). He also became the first Mountaineer player since Calvin Bowman (2001) to post three consecutive double-double games.
- For his performances against Duquesne and Davidson, Ebanks was named BIG EAST Rookie of the Week. He is the fifth Mountaineer player to earn BIG EAST Rookie of the Week honors in school history: Da'Sean Butler (twice in 2006-07), Kevin Pittsnogle (twice in 2002-03), Jonathan Hargett (2001-02) and Gordon Malone (1996-97).
- Jones is averaging 5.9 points and 4.2 rebounds. He had a season-high 11 points against Delaware State. Most recently, he had nine points and six rebounds in the win at Duquesne. Against Duquesne, WVU's freshmen combined for 42 of WVU's 68 points.
- Proby is averaging 1.0 points and 1.3 rebounds.
- WVU's newcomers have played 591 out of 1,800 possible minutes (32.8 percent) this season.
- They have accounted for 35.9 percent of West Virginia's scoring and 35.8 percent of WVU's rebounding this season.

Assists

- West Virginia is 30-2 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 29-0 under Bob Huggins when outshooting the opponent.
- West Virginia has allowed the opponent to shoot over 50 percent only six times under Bob Huggins.
- West Virginia is 13-0 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 25-2 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding the opponent.
- West Virginia is 28-3 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 16-2 at home under Bob Huggins.
- Fourteen of Bob Huggins' 33 WVU victories have been by 20 points or more.
- Seventeen of Bob Huggins' 33 WVU victories have been away from the WVU Coliseum.
- The Mountaineers posted 58 rebounds against Davidson, their highest rebounding total in a game since grabbing 58 boards against Alabama A&M on Nov. 14, 1998.
- WVU had 29 offensive rebounds against Davidson, its most in a game since posted 31 offensive boards against Rutgers on Jan. 27, 2002. It was the 10th time in school history WVU had 30 or more offensive rebounds in a game.
- WVU's attendance against Elon in the season opener was 10,250. It marked the second time in school history that the Mountaineers have posted a crowd over 10,000 at home in the month of November.

Huggins Adds Another Top Recruiting Class

- Last year, Bob Huggins put together one of the top recruiting classes in school history in his first season as head coach at West Virginia. In his second year, Huggins has added another strong class that will join WVU in 2009-10.
- Dalton Pepper, Deniz Kilicli and Danny Jennings all signed letters of intent during the November signing period.
- Pepper, a 6-foot-5, 215-pound shooting guard, is currently in his senior year at Pennsbury High. A native of Levittown, Pa., Pepper averaged 22 points, 9.6 rebounds per game and shot 50 percent from the floor as a junior en route to being a first-team Pennsylvania Class AAAA all-state selection.
- Kilicli, a 6-foot-9, 260-pound forward, is currently in his senior year at Mountain State Academy in Beckley, W.Va. A native of Istanbul, Turkey, Kilicli played for the Pertevniyal Istanbul Club team and for the Turkish men's national team at the European Championships, where he averaged 11.1 points and 5.8 rebounds per game.
- Jennings is a 6-foot-8, 255-pound forward from Staten Island, N.Y. Jennings is currently in his senior year at St. Thomas More School in Oakdale, Conn. Jennings previously attended Oak Hill Academy and Bishop Loughlin High in Brooklyn, N.Y.

Preseason Bits

- West Virginia was predicted to finish ninth in the BIG EAST preseason coaches' poll. The Mountaineers were predicted ahead of Providence, Cincinnati, Rutgers, Seton Hall, St. John's, DePaul and USF.
- In the past six seasons, the Mountaineers have finished higher than their preseason prediction. Last year, WVU was predicted to finish 10th and finished fifth. Two years ago, WVU was predicted 12th and finished seventh. Three years ago, the Mountaineers were predicted fifth and finished third.

Recap

A 54-point outburst in the second half allowed West Virginia to run away with a 92-47 victory over Elon in the 2008-09 opener at the WVU Coliseum.

The Mountaineers out-rebounded the Phoenix 38-22, including a 12-5 advantage in offensive rebounds. WVU also shot an impressive 34-of-58 (58.6 percent) from the floor, while Elon was 16-of-44 (36.4 percent).

Senior Alex Ruoff and junior DaSean Butler led WVU with 19 points apiece. Butler was also the team's leading rebounder, grabbing six boards to go along with his 8-of-13 shooting performance.

Another key to the Mountaineers' season-opening win was their bench, which outscored the Phoenix 33-7. Darryl "Truck" Bryant had 12 points, including 2-for-2 from the 3-point line, and Kevin Jones added nine points to lead WVU off the bench.

WVU was 10-of-17 from the 3-point line (58.8 percent) and forced 24 turnovers. Butler and Ruoff also led the Mountaineers with six steals apiece, while Wellington Smith registered two blocks to help make his presence felt on the defensive end.

The Mountaineers extended their 11-point halftime lead to 20 on Butler's 3-pointer with 12:48 left in the second half. A 29-5 run ensued, capped by a 3 from the right wing by freshman Devin Ebanks to make it 80-41 with 5:29 remaining.

Another 3-pointer by Bryant created a 40-point margin for WVU at the 4:51 mark. Bryant also made an acrobatic drive in transition earlier in the half when he faked a pass to his right and delivered on a difficult finish with his left hand.

Notebook

- West Virginia's announced attendance of 10,250 was just the second time in the 38-year history of the WVU Coliseum that more than 10,000 showed up for a November game (the other was for LSU in 2006 when Jerry West's number was retired).
- West Virginia now owns an 86-14 all-time record in season openers, including an 91-9 record in home openers at the ROTC Armory (1903-15), The Ark (1916-27), Stansbury Hall (1928-69), Charleston Civic Center (1999) and WVU Coliseum (1970-98, 2000-present).
- West Virginia and Elon played for the first time in school history.
- Junior Joe Mazzulla made his first career start for WVU.

Recap

West Virginia defeated Longwood, 86-54, in its first game of the Las Vegas Invitational at the WVU Coliseum.

The Mountaineers were led by the play of Darryl "Truck" Bryant, who provided another double-figure scoring effort off the bench. The Brooklyn, N.Y., resident totaled 16 points on 4-of-6 shooting, including 2-of-2 from 3-point range.

Senior Alex Ruoff contributed 12 points, shooting 5-of-12 from the floor. He also added seven rebounds, while DaSean Butler also chipped in with 12 points, going 3-of-6 from the floor in 25 minutes of action.

WVU shot well for the second straight contest, going 26-of-56 shooting (46.4 percent). The Mountaineers used plenty of ball pressure to coax the Lancers into shooting 30.4 percent from the field.

Scoring from inside was not a problem for WVU, which totaled 32 points in the paint. Wellington Smith and John Flowers added eight points apiece, and Devin Ebanks finished with seven.

The Mountaineers out-rebounded Longwood by a 2-to-1 ratio, finishing with 54 boards while the Lancers mustered 27 rebounds. WVU, however, was bitten by 23 turnovers, but was able to force 21 Lancer turnovers.

Jonnie West chipped in five points, all in the second half. WVU amassed 48 second half points. Joe Mazzulla added eight points and dished out a team-high four assists in 23 minutes of play.

WVU overcame a sluggish start to end the first half on an offensive flurry, taking a 43-19 lead at halftime.

The Mountaineer defense stifled Longwood, holding the Lancers to 7-of-25 shooting (28 percent), while WVU shot 50 percent (15-30) through the first 20 minutes. The Mountaineers managed to

Recap

A strong second half defensive performance propelled West Virginia to a 53-43 victory over Cleveland State at the WVU Coliseum.

After a poor first half of play, the Mountaineers executed their game plan much better in the second half. WVU suffocated the Vikings with its man-to-man pressure, forcing CSU to commit 21 turnovers while holding the Vikings to 33.3 percent shooting.

DaSean Butler paced WVU with 18 points on 7-of-16 shooting, leading the Mountaineers in scoring for the second straight contest. Devin Ebanks put forth a workmanlike double-double effort, tallying 10 points along with a game-high 17 rebounds.

WVU received contributions from almost its entire bench with as many as 12 players seeing some action. Starting point guard Joe Mazzulla was held out of the game after sustaining a bruised shoulder at Ole Miss. Starting in Mazzulla's place was freshman Truck Bryant, who played just 12 minutes, scoring three points and committing three turnovers.

The Mountaineers were able to cash in from the free throw line in the second half, making 15-of-18 from the charity to help extend their lead and counter their 29 percent second-half shooting.

The Mountaineers were a season-best 15-of-21 (71.4 percent) overall from the line. WVU also scored nearly half of its points off turnovers, getting 24 off Viking miscues.

Defensively, WVU recorded 10 blocked shots. John Flowers led with four swats in 16 minutes of action, while Ebanks followed with two blocks and three steals.

WVU took its second lead of the game with 17:15 left when Jonnie West hit a momentum-changing 3 pointer from the left baseline, giving the Mountaineers a 30-28 advantage. They followed with a 19-8 run, reaching a double-digit lead with 5:48 remaining when Ruoff's free throw put WVU ahead by 10.

Notebook

- Senior guard Alex Ruoff became the 45th Mountaineer to score 1,000 career points, achieving the feat with a layup at the 8:19 mark in the first half.
- Devin Ebanks became the first Mountaineer freshman to record a double-double since Damian Owens had 18 points and 12 rebounds against Duquesne on Feb. 28, 1995.

Recap

Stephen Curry overcame a poor shooting night by making shots when they counted most, scoring 27 points on 9-of-27 shooting to lead the No. 23-rated Wildcats to a 68-65 come-from-behind victory over West Virginia in the Jimmy V Classic at Madison Square Garden.

During a five-minute stretch Curry scored all 13 points for Davidson, including back-to-back 3s to turn a 62-58 West Virginia advantage into a 64-62 Wildcat lead. Curry added two more from the free throw line with 18 seconds left.

"The kid makes two incredible shots to beat us," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins. "I don't care who you are, those are hard shots. He didn't shoot the ball that well. We guarded him and we bothered him. For him to step up and make those shots at the end of the game ... he's a great player."

John Flowers made a twisting 3 from the corner with 3.8 seconds left to pull West Virginia to within two, 67-65. Bryant Barr was fouled on the inbound pass and converted the first of two free throws; his missed second free throw try gave the Mountaineers a desperation attempt from half court to tie the game that Devin Ebanks missed off the top of the glass.

West Virginia was severely undermanned. Alex Ruoff was a late scratch with back spasms and Joe Mazzulla tried to go after missing the Cleveland State game with a shoulder injury sustained at Mississippi. But Mazzulla played just six minutes before giving way to Truck Bryant.

For most of the second half the Mountaineers played with three freshmen - Bryant, Ebanks and Kevin Jones - and eventually were able to overcome an 11-point Davidson lead to make it 52-51.

West Virginia relied solely on Butler in the second half for offense and the junior finished with a career high 24 points to go with 14 rebounds. Ebanks scored 13 points and grab 17 rebounds, while Cam Thoroughman pulled down eight rebounds to help the Mountaineers to a 58-32 advantage on the glass. Twenty five of those rebounds came on the offensive end.

- Devin Ebanks became the first Mountaineer freshman in school history to grab 17 or more rebounds in back-to-back games.
